What really drives the price

Every Garage Door job has the same core pieces: the door itself, the equipment that lifts it, the opener that automates it, and the proficient labor to set everything square and risk-free. Those break down into several drivers.

Door dimension sets the baseline. A common single door at 8 feet broad by 7 feet high normally costs much much less than a double at 16 by 7. Odd dimensions, like 9 by 8 or 18 by 8, press you off mass production rails and increase cost. A solitary steel door can start around 700 to 1,200 bucks for the slab just, while a double often begins at 1,200 and climbs up past 3,500 prior to you add equipment or installation.
