

San Miguel de Allende glows like a well-kept secret that tourists quietly guard. The first time I visited, I landed after a red-eye and found the city bathed in warm light, cobblestones still damp from an afternoon shower, and a scent of fresh espresso mingling with vanilla and orange blossoms.
