- **Check for SSL Encryption:** Ensure the URL begins with <https://> and features a padlock icon.
- **Research Community Reputation:** Look for reviews on Trustpilot, Reddit (such as [r/GlobalOffensiveTrade](https://www.reddit.com/r/GlobalOffensiveTrade) or gambling-related subreddits), and independent review blog sites. Avoid sites with a history of unresolved scam accusations.
- **Validate the "Provably Fair" Mechanic:** Legitimate websites allow gamers to independently verify the randomness of every battle using cryptographic hashes.
- **Secure Your Steam Credentials:** Never log into your Steam account on a suspicious pop-up window. Constantly utilize the main OpenID login provided directly by Valve.
- **Set a Budget:** Treat case battles as home entertainment, not a trusted source of income. Never gamble more than you can easily pay for to lose.

- **Skins:** The site's bot sends out a trade offer straight to your Steam account consisting of the virtual products you won.
- **Cryptocurrency/Cash:** Some platforms permit you to squander your balance by means of crypto (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) or alternative payment processors.

4. What does "Provably Fair" mean?

A "Provably Fair" system uses cryptography to show that the result of a case battle was predetermined and might not be altered by the website operator *after* you placed your bet. You can confirm the fairness of each round using the provided server seeds and client seeds.

5. Can I get VAC prohibited for using case battle websites?

Using third-party trading and case-opening websites does not straight result in a Valve Anti-Cheat (VAC) ban. However, Valve occasionally updates its regards to service or bans API keys associated with automated trading bots, which can temporarily interrupt your ability to trade skins.
