Factors That Influence Car Locksmith Costs

1. The Complexity of the Lock and Key Technology

Modern lorries have actually evolved far beyond simple metal keys. The development of car security straight affects locksmith rates:

- **Mechanical Keys:** Older cars and trucks use easy brass or steel keys. They are low-cost and fast to cut.

Furthermore, if the car is parked in a difficult-to-reach location-- such as a deep, multi-level underground parking lot-- some specialists might charge an additional convenience or difficulty charge.

4. Car Make and Model

Luxury, exotic, and high-end import lorries (such as **car locksmith** Mercedes-Benz, BMW, Land Rover, and Audi) feature proprietary security systems.
