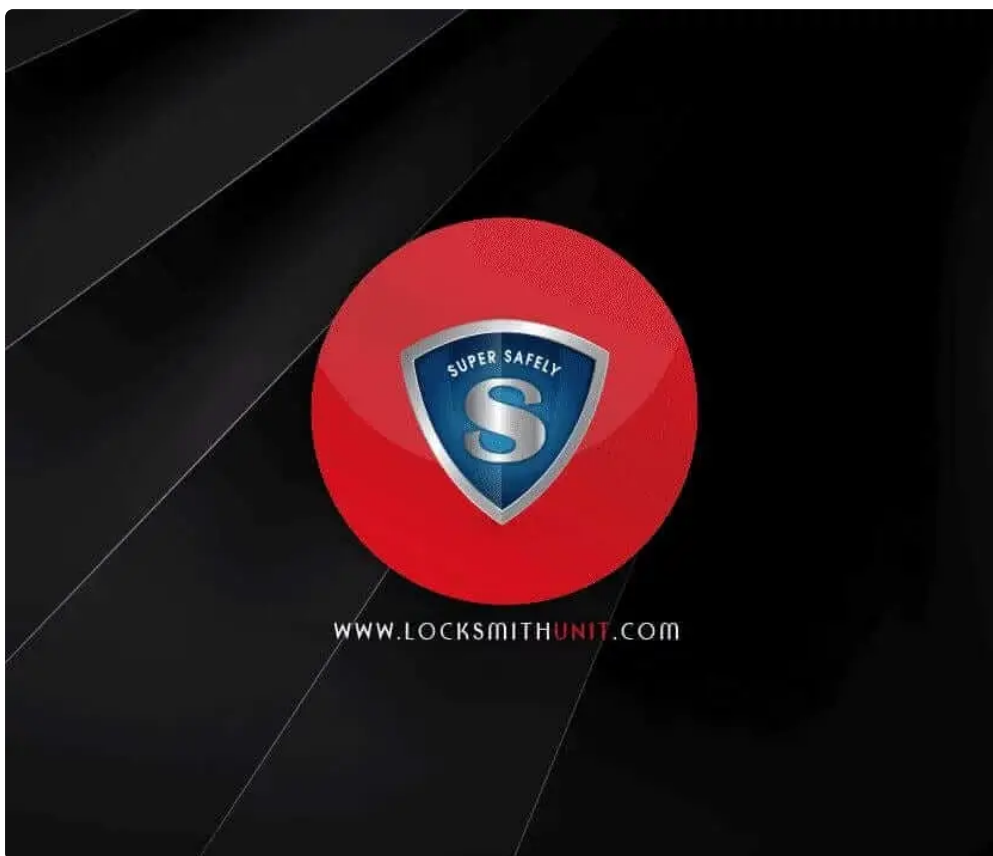
## What happens when electronic keys fail
