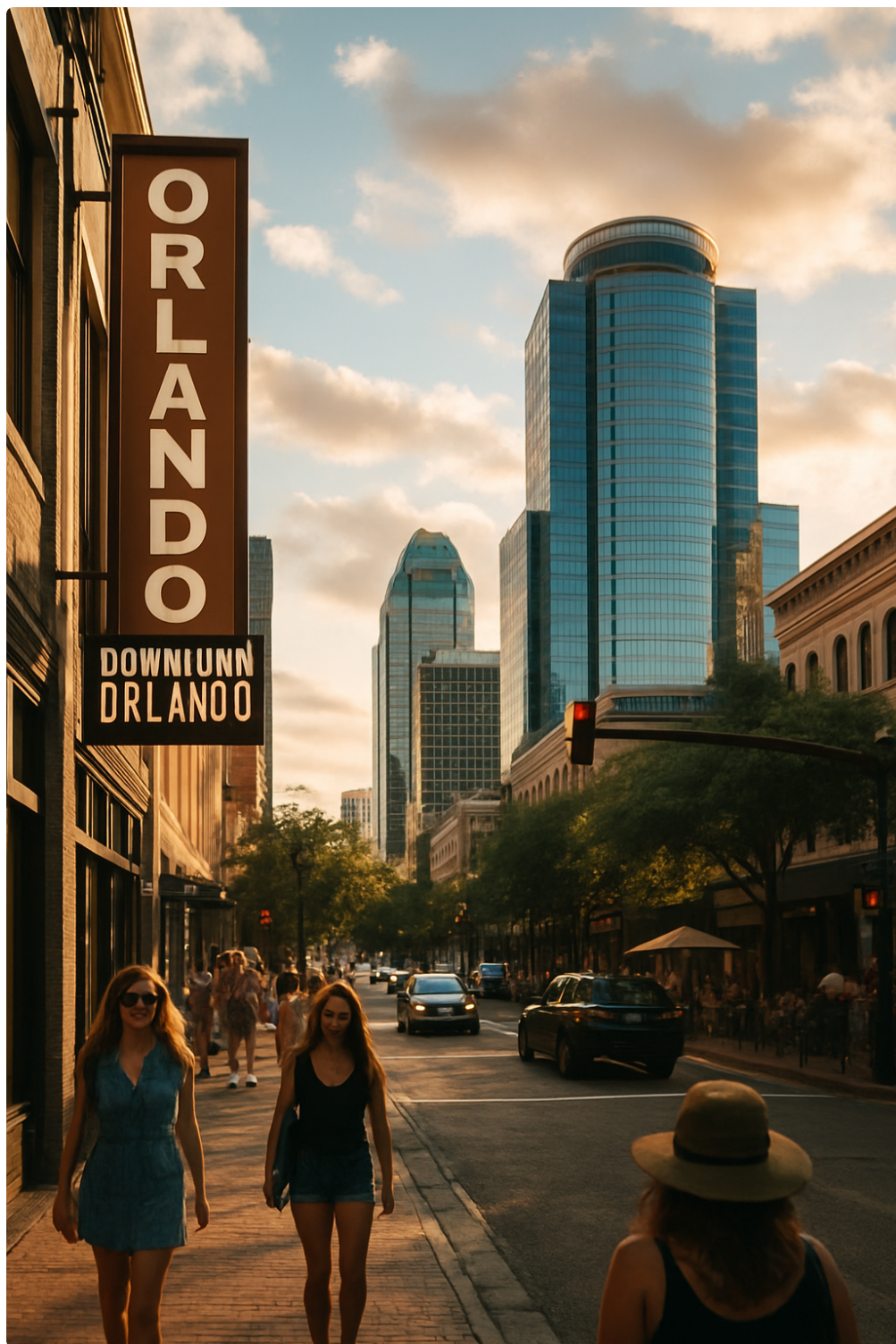
Licensing, trust, and what customers should check
