- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.44 (Heavy wear)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.44-- 1.00 (Extremely used, often funny look)

*Note: Some skins are "wear-capped," meaning they can not drop in Factory New condition, making lower float variations incredibly unusual and valuable.*
