

Los Angeles vs. Culver City: Which Area Fits Your Lifestyle?

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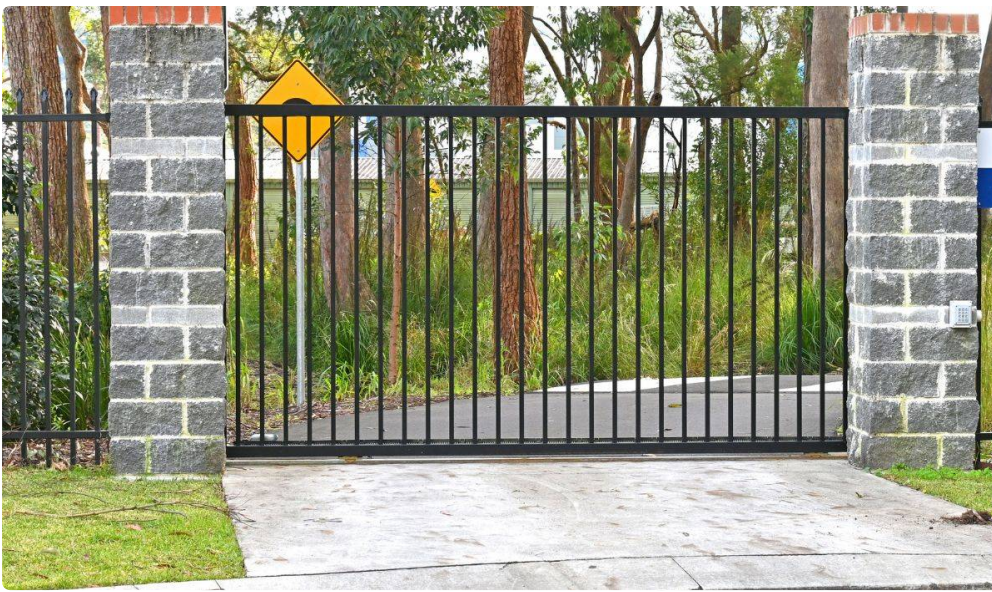
